This month, the DISCIPULUS consortium has been busily producing a report based on the first consultation exercise, which took place in March.

April also sees a step-up in our dissemination activities, with a short video release aimed at increasing awareness about the project. We are continuing in our preparation on a report on the scientific and technological requirements for the Digital Patient.

At the same time, we are using the information from the consultation process to formulate example clinical scenarios, ensuring that the endusers of the technologies are considered.

The first draft of the roadmap is well underway, and will be released soon. It is hoped that further consultation with academic, industrial and clinical experts will then be integrated into the final roadmap.
